The International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) requires that aviation industry personnel attain a standard of English at ICAO level 4 or above.

These ELPAC Aviation English accredited classes will consolidate general English skills with a particular focus on improving listening and speaking ability in aviation industry contexts.

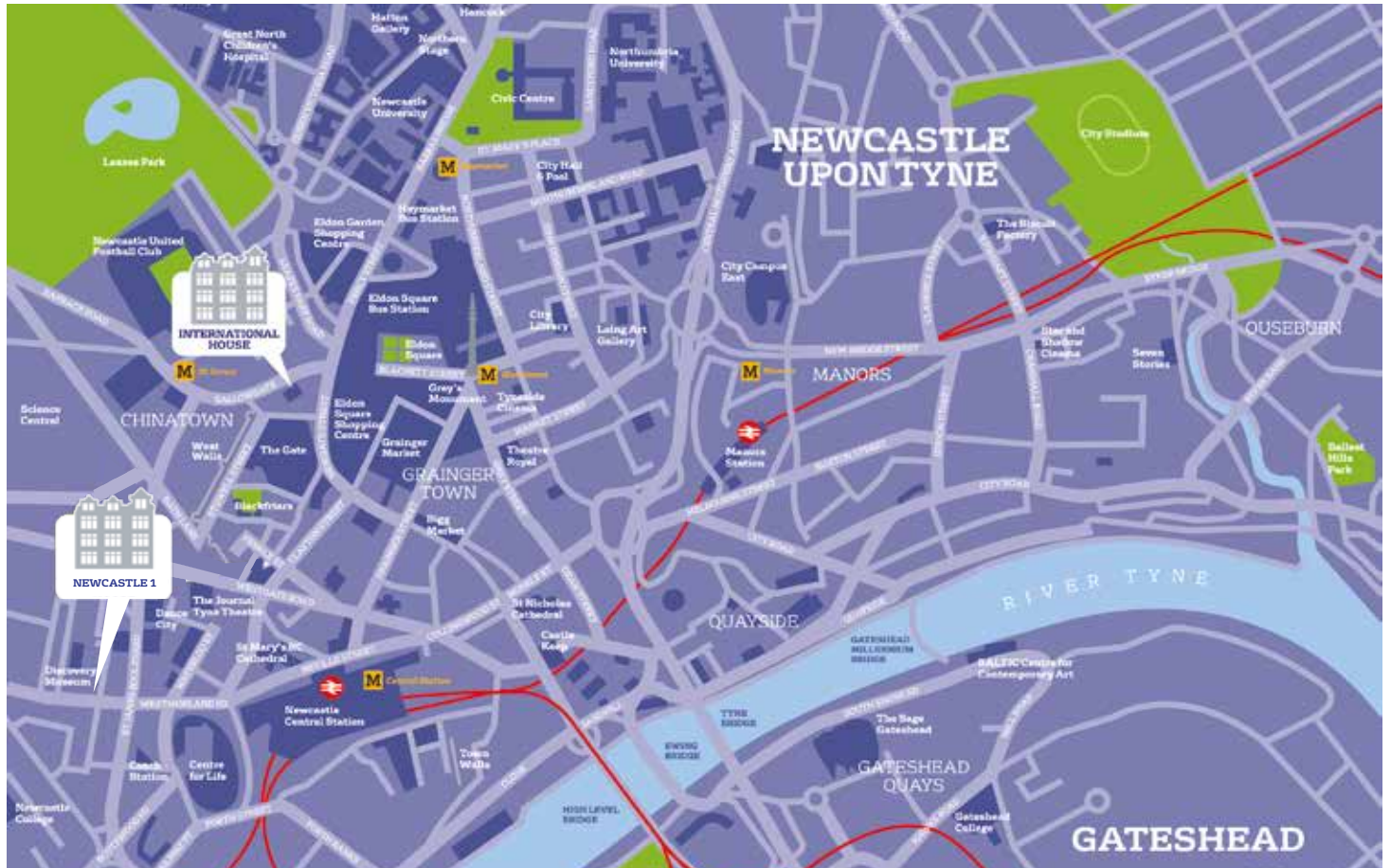

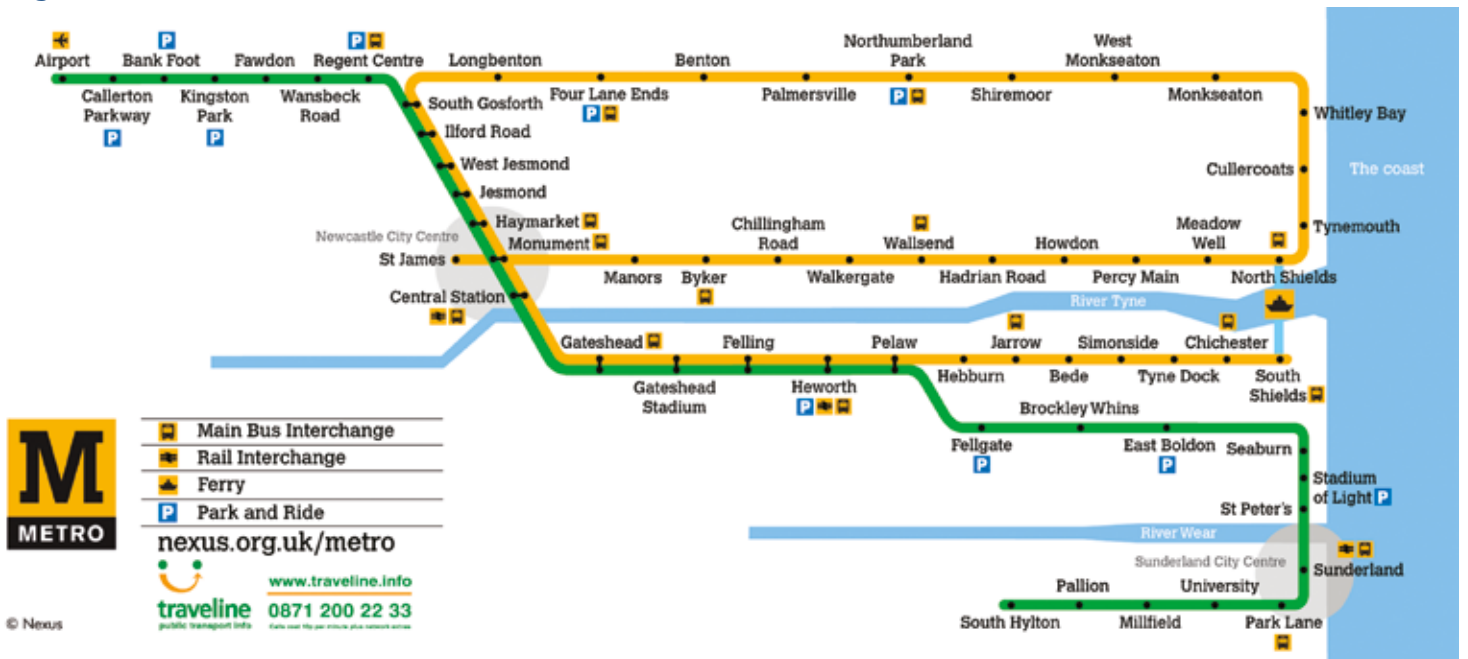
Weekend Excursions

Lessons

Each lesson (teaching hour) is 55 minutes long. Our class size is 12 students maximum (8 students average).

Timetable

Lessons are between 9am and 5pm, Monday to Friday. The timetable will depend on your level, the course and the number of hours you have booked.

EARLY TIMETABLE: 9am-11am then 1pm-3pm or

LATE TIMETABLE: 11am-1pm then 3pm-5pm

Plus the PSP hour(s) if applicable. Your timetable will be confirmed after your day one placement test.

Junior Bookings

All under-18s must comply with UK laws; in particular, regarding the consumption of alcohol and tobacco. Their parents or guardians must complete a Parental Consent form. If the school does not receive the completed form, it will be assumed that the rules and conditions have been accepted by the parents/guardian (however, in this case, the host family does not have to accept responsibility for enforcing the curfew).

All under-18s must have return transfers booked through the school unless suitable alternative arrangements have been made and confirmed in writing. If you have arranged an Unaccompanied Minor Service with an airline, please consult the school 1 week prior to travel to confirm staff details.

Public Holidays

The school will close on UK public holidays (please note that no refund can be given for these days).

Accommodation

Accommodation bookings are from Sunday to Sunday, unless requested in advance. Arrival after 2pm and departure before 10am where possible. Extra nights can be arranged however please confirm availability before booking your flight.

Visas

International House Newcastle holds a Sponsor Licence for Tier 4 of the Points Based System, and is permitted under UK Home Office rules to accept visa students for study. If you are a student from outside of the European Economic Area, you may need to apply for a visa to enter the UK. This can be checked on the Home Office webpage.

Visa students need to supply:

1. Course application fully completed, including a UK address if accommodation has not been requested via the school.
2. Full payment of fees or proof of government sponsorship plus booking fee.
3. A copy of the passport.
