


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There are some great views from our language school campus.

SPANISH COURSES

Our programmes take place throughout the year, except during the Christmas holidays.

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Methodology

You will be totally immersed in the Spanish language and culture speaking Spanish from day 1. A co-ordinated system of teacher rotation and tuition groups that are made up of students of different nationalities, ensure that the classes are always stimulating and engaging.

More than 45 years' experience guarantees a high quality of teaching from teachers who are constantly encouraging and motivating the students to use their Spanish. The majority of the textbooks and supplementary teaching materials are created by our teachers.

On our main General Spanish courses, we use an eclectic, integrated method combining aspects of the communicative approach with structured learning of grammar and syntax. This involves elements of traditional teaching methods, as well as classroom activities such as language games, pair work and role plays.

We are regularly inspected by independent teaching experts and this external quality control is your guarantee that our programmes are of a high standard.

Level test

On the first day you will take a placement test consisting of a written and oral exam. The test ensures that you will be placed, along with other students of the same level, in an appropriate group.

The CEFR and Malaca Instituto levels

The diagram below indicates what a student can do in Spanish after completing each level of our programme. These "descriptors" are in line with the Common European Framework.



A1 Can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.

A2 Can describe in simple terms aspects of his/her background, immediate environment and matters in areas of immediate need.

B1 Can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes & ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

B2 Can interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party.

C1 Can use language flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes.

C2 Can express him/herself spontaneously, very fluently and precisely, differentiating finer shades of meaning even in more complex situations.

• Students do not usually go from beginner to B2 in 16 weeks. They invariably need to repeat to take more time in assimilating the language.

• Level B2: An average student studying from total beginner level can usually achieve a B2 level in 20 weeks. Students without a European language background will invariably take longer.

• Level C2: While it is possible in 48 weeks for a competent European language background student to cover the grammatical structures of a C2 level and acquire a wide-ranging vocabulary, a real C2 level also requires several years living and communicating in a Spanish speaking environment.

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GENERAL SPANISH

We offer all language levels from total beginner to advanced, covering all aspects of the Spanish language. In addition to the lessons there are 7 free of charge cultural/social activities per week.

General Spanish

Courses start every Monday throughout the year, except for complete beginners who have frequent specific starting dates (see dates and fees leaflet).

The programme consists of progressive weekly modules of 4 lessons per day with a maximum of 10 students per class.

In order to pass to the next module, students must sit a short test at the end of the week which is then corrected during class hours.

For those finishing a complete level (A, B, C) a longer test can be taken outside scheduled class hours.

× Intensive 20: 20 less/week

You may also add a further 4 or 6 lessons per week of oral communication skills (max. 6 students per class) to make 24 or 26 lessons in total per week.



These courses are offered at all levels. On the rare occasions on which there is only 1 student at a particular level we reserve the right to negotiate an alternative study plan.



One-to-one (Individual tuition)

Some students choose to book additional 1-1 classes for the added intensity and individual attention that these classes offer. These lessons are best booked in advance but can be requested once here.

Certificates

Students receive Attendance Certificates for courses satisfactorily attended & Certificates of Linguistic Competence for end-of-level exams passed.

DELE EXAM PREPARATION

This course is for students who want to study for an official diploma confirming their level of Spanish. Twice a year we run preparation courses for DELE levels A2, B1 and B2.

We can also offer preparation for the other exam dates and levels in individual or closed group lessons on a request basis. **DELE Examination preparation** (Diploma de español como lengua extranjera)

The DELE examinations, organised by the Instituto Cervantes, are the most important examinations for Spanish as a foreign language and are officially recognised by the Spanish Government.



The Exams are offered at 6 levels: A1, A2, B1, B2, C1 and C2 in accordance with the Common European Framework.

Our school is an official DELE examination centre enabling our students to take the exams in the same place as they are studying.

The duration of the specific exam preparation element – once the overall general level has been achieved - is 2 weeks for A2 and 4 weeks for B1 and B2.

Many students study on a general Intensive course first to achieve the level needed for the exam preparation.

During the course, students not only practice the different skills which will be examined, but will also have mock exams to familiarise themselves with the actual examination.

Prior to booking a course, students must take a level test to assess their level and to determine whether they can join an exam class directly or need to take a general Intensive course first.

Combinations of *Intensive* courses and *Exam preparation* can be taken as detailed in the table below:

Based on the level test we will advise the length of study needed (usually between 10 and 25 weeks for a European background student) including the specific Exam course of 2 or 4 weeks.

Courses

GAP YEAR UNIVERSITY EXPERIENCE, HISPANIC STUDIES

These are attractive programmes for students looking for a useful Gap Year experience with the aim of achieving a high level of Spanish. The University Experience will be an invaluable preparation for University life, while Hispanic Studies will also provide a useful insight into the Spanish way of life and Hispanic culture in general.

Spanish + University Experience

Duration: 40 weeks (20+20) Spanish + University Experience

First you study Spanish to reach at least a B2 level: typically around 5 months. You then study for 5 months at Spanish University alongside Spanish students where you can create your own programme by selecting the subjects of most interest to you and for which you can gain up to 30 ECTS (European Academic credit).

This is a perfect way to spend a gap year, gaining CV enhancing skills and life experience.

Spanish + Hispanic Studies

This programme is for students aged 16 years + and is an ideal programme for pre or post-university students who want to gain language and cultural career-enhancing skills.

The course is divided into 2 Terms (1 academic year) which can be taken separately assuming the correct level of Spanish:

• Term I (beginning in August): 4-16 weeks.

Entry level: Beginner to Intermediate.

An **Intensive general Spanish** course from beginner level. Students with some knowledge of Spanish may join the course at weekly intervals according to their needs and objectives.

• Term II (beginning in January): 4-20 weeks.

Entry level: Having completed B2, module 2.

This term is a combination of Advanced Spanish (10 less/week) and an overview of Spanish culture and civilisation. It is designed in 4-week modules (10 less/week) to allow students to come for shorter periods choosing the modules they want.

4-week Modules:

All courses are made up of Advanced Spanish plus:

- *Hispanic* 1. (January) Spanish cinema and The Media.
- *Hispanic* 2. (February), social and political institutions and the Spanish economy.
- *Hispanic 3.* (March), geography, history I, and art history I.
- *Hispanic 4.* (April), Spanish way of life, history II and literature I.
- *Hispanic* 5. (May), history III, art history II and literature II.



You can choose to enrol for both Terms or, depending on your level, only Term II, or any of the Term II modules.

Spanish and Internships

In today's business world the ability to communicate in several languages is essential. However, young people and employers are increasingly looking for more than this. They want inter-cultural business skills of the sort that can only be gained by working in different countries.

Malaca Instituto organises internship placements in Málaga.

Duration: 3 months or longer.

Entry level: Spanish course - **all levels**. Internship - **B2** (this can vary according to type of Internship).

As you need a B2 level to enter the Internship, the amount of **Intensive Spanish** you take with us will depend on your actual level. In any case we require that you take **a minimum of 4 weeks Intensive Spanish**, which can be combined with the first month of Internship.

¤ Internship placement.

Minimum 3 months, non-paid internship in a local company.

Internships can be offered in a variety of professional areas such as:

- Marketing and advertising
- Design
- Hospitality, tourism and gastronomy
- Healthcare
- Education

Supervision: we liaise with a supervisor in each host company whose role is to ensure that you gain the necessary experiences to meet your objectives.

University students can also get funding for Spanish courses combined with Internships and should ask their Universities to advise them.

UNIVERSITY ACCESS UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES

If you are considering studying for an undergraduate degree at a Spanish University, Malaca Instituto will not only enable you to reach the level of fluency needed in Spanish but will also prepare you in the subject areas you may require for University entrance and help you in the University application procedures.

For those who would like to gain a high level of Spanish and a first experience of university study, we offer a Spanish plus University semester programme. See page 26.

Entry to Undergraduate Degrees

Spain has some of the oldest Universities in Europe and a great academic tradition. With over 500 million people speaking Spanish in the world and being the second most used business language, a degree taken in Spanish is a highly valuable CV item.

For more than 20 years we have been preparing students successfully for Spanish University access exams. In the past these were compulsory for non-EU students to enter Undergraduate Degree programmes.

Previously known as Selectividad, there are now exams called (PCE/EBAU) and we prepare for these from January through May each year.

However, some Universities are now offering the opportunity to non-EU students to apply for guaranteed places ("Early Admission") on some degrees on the basis of their high school or university entrance scores. Deadline dates and requirements vary widely and we strongly recommend that students apply for "Early Admission" and also take our PCE Exam preparation course as a back-up.



University

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To join this course you must already have achieved a B2 level of Spanish. *Most of our students therefore study between 3-9 months of* **Intensive Spanish** prior to the January start date.

This course not only guarantees a high level of Spanish and a quality preparation for the exam subjects, but it also serves as a perfect pre-University programme.

We provide detailed consultancy on which subjects to take in the entry exams, according to the University and Degree of choice, and help with the procedures for University entrance. We prepare students for exams in both humanities and science subjects.

If you are interested in preparing to enter an Undergraduate Degree programme in Spain, please ask us for the up-to-the-minute information and the best access route for you.

UNIVERSITY ACCESS PREPARATION FOR MASTER DEGREES

If you want to take a Masters degree at a Spanish University, Malaca Instituto can provide you with a specific preparation programme which will help you to acquire the language level necessary to study at University (minimum B2) and will also provide you with counselling and advice in choosing and enrolling for the best programme.



Access to MASTERS Degrees

A wide range of MASTERS degrees are offered in Spain, some of which are in English. We strongly advise that you should study at University in Spain in Spanish. After all, this is the world's 2nd business language and it will enhance your CV.

To be able to successfully study in Spanish at University level you will need at least a B2 level of Spanish. For complete beginners, it can take between 5 to 12 months of Intensive Spanish to achieve this level, depending on your linguistic background and abilities.

The access to "**MASTERS DEGREE**" programme combines:

× Intensive 20: 20 lessons/week. Duration: 28 weeks- depending on your level of Spanish.

Exam Preparation DELE B2 Duration: **4 weeks**. 20 lessons/week.

Some Masters Degrees in Spain, are now requiring an official pass at DELE B2.

You will also receive our expert advice regarding the choice of your Master's degree and we will help you with the all the necessary documentation needed to enrol.

You will find that not only is the cost of living substantially cheaper in Spain than in many countries, but the cost of official Masters Degrees at the most prestigious Spanish Universities, is also much cheaper.



Students should be in Spain from January as the best enrolment dates for Masters Degrees are in February and March when places are available on all Degree courses starting in October. Therefore, we recommend that you plan to start your course with us in January and study for as long as you need to obtain the correct level.

YOUNG ADULTS SPRING & SUMMER






Activities HALF-DAY EXCURSIONS

Activities FULL-DAY EXCURSIONS


